Food Contact Seminar held on May 18th in Brussels Launch of the Industry Guideline

This seminar has been held to formally launch the Industry Guidelines, under development within the paper industry over the past 6 years.

The voluntary "Industry Guideline for the Compliance of Paper & Board Materials and Articles for Food Contact", jointly developed by The Confederation of European Paper Industries (CEPI) and the International Confederation of Paper and Board Converters in Europe (CITPA) is now available.

The Guideline, which has been independently peer reviewed by PIRA International, covers all paper and board materials and articles intended for food contact. It gives guidance for establishing compliance with (EC) Framework Regulation 1935/2004 to paper and board producers as well as institutions and public authorities. The guidelines will ensure that the materials will not endanger human health by causing an unacceptable change in the food's composition or deterioration in the way the food tastes, looks, feels and smells.

The Paper and Board sector has a longstanding commitment to the protection of human health and to the interests of consumers through the provision of safe and effective materials. Many of the materials which come into direct contact with food. such as cellulose film, plastics and ceramics, are subject to material-specific measures which apply uniformly throughout the EU. For paper and board, on the other hand, the picture is fragmented, with countries such as Germany, France, the Netherlands and Italy having national legislation, while other countries simply conform with the more general, non-material specific regulation 1935/2004. The unintended impression given to buyers is that compliance for paper and board is less clear than for other materials.

So it is against this background that the European paper packaging value chain has compiled the voluntary Industry Guideline for the Compliance of Paper & Board Materials and Articles for Food Contact (the Guideline). "The industry has cooperated over a long period of time with governments, both at national and international level, and with other regulators, to make every provision

necessary for the protection of consumers The fact that the European Commission has chosen to regulate other materials instead of paper and board may be seen as a disadvantage but it is not seen as such within the sector. "Our industry has taken the initiative to regulate itself on a voluntary basis. The guideline is providing the methodology for demonstrating the suitability of paper and board materials and articles for food contact, now it is time to demonstrate that the end result has been worth waiting for." explains Maria Casado, CITPA Secretary General.

"The launch of the Industry

Guideline is a key step forward for our sector: it has been a successful development whose core strength is its voluntary nature. To build on this success we should now adopt the Guideline and promote it widely. We count on your continuing support and your feedback!" *John Swift*

Why should the industry adopt the Guideline?

The Industry Guideline provides an efficient and "tailor-made" means of demonstrating compliance of paper and board with



the core requirements of the Framework Regulation for materials and articles in contact with food. Developed

by experts representing all elements of the paper and board chain in consultation with regulators and with food producers, the use of the Guideline is an excellent way to provide confidence in the safety of paper and board for food packaging for all stakeholders.

Seed Pack Wins CPI-Sponsored Award



The winners of the CPI-sponsored Starpack Student Award, Santi Tonsukha and Adam Paterson, have demonstrated how corrugated

packaging can be used in a totally new way (see picture of Mr. Tonsukha and Mr. Barnetson / CPI). They have created a "grow your own" pack for fruit and vegetable seeds, ideal for novice gardeners.

Their research programme revealed that gardeners tend not to use all the seeds in a pack at once, and that allotment holders generally prefer to grow and eat a range of produce rather than harvesting a large amount of the same crop. Equipped with these two insights, the award winners designed a seed packet that takes advantage of the unique structure of corrugated by storing a range of seeds within its flutes. This enables each variety of seed to be held in thin rows, allowing them to be easily and controllably shaken out.



The 100% recyclable and re-sealable pack, made from a single piece of corrugated, met the CPI's brief of being simple, sustainable and innovative. The natural matt colour and aesthetic of the pack presents information clearly, in contrast to other seed packages that can be confusing to the novice gardener.

France/ ONDEF

Paper and Board Packaging Festival!

On 23rd March 2010, professionals from the Paper & Board sector opened their doors to French school children, inviting primary school teachers to come to their plant and get free raw materials for their craftwork.

This national initiative known as the "Paper & Board Festival" has become very popular and its reputation continues to grow. Once again it is sponsored by the Ministry of National Education, which is disseminating the information to schools.

More than 200 manufacturers have joined this initiative and have offered all kinds of materials, such as die-cutting waste, but also folding carton and corrugated board sheets, wrapping materials and paper sacks.

These basic raw materials will be used for cutting, folding, gluing, painting, and will then be turned into imaginative paper & board creations.



DS Smith Kaysersberg's plant in Kunheim (Alsace) has been participating in this project since 2003, distributing each year to schools between 12 and 15 tonnes of corrugated materials (mainly sheets with white unbleached or white top liner). An average of about 300 classrooms (from kindergarten to primary and secondary schools) located up to 100 km from the plant, obtain their supplies from DS Smith Kunheim for their various craftwork and DIY (do-ityourself) projects.
